**Background:**

The Utah State Board of Education has established a Seal of Biliteracy. The following was adopted by the Board of Education.

The USBE's Seal of Biliteracy certifies attainment of a high level of proficiency by a graduating high school student in one or more languages in addition to English, and certifies that the graduate meets the following criteria:

- 1) The USBE's Seal of Biliteracy will be awarded to students who earn a Utah high school diploma and are proficient in English and at least one world language other than English, at the **intermediate-mid** level or higher, as demonstrated through an assessment from a list to be approved by the Superintendent of Public Instruction.
- 2) For purposes of this form, "world language" means a language other than English, and includes American Sign Language, Latin, and American Native Languages.
